

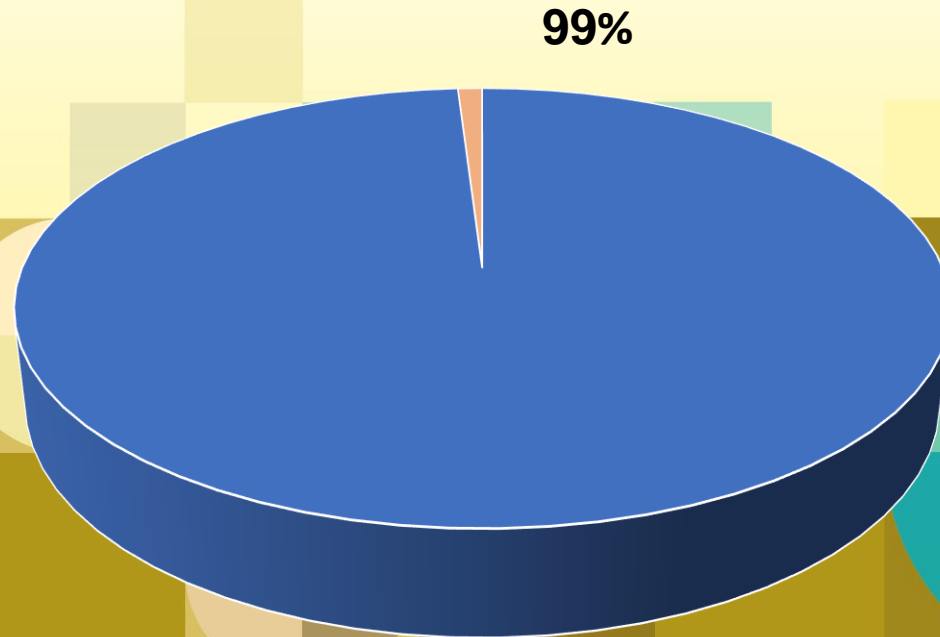


# Marine Conservation Survey Result

## 香港首次學界海洋保育關注問卷調查結果

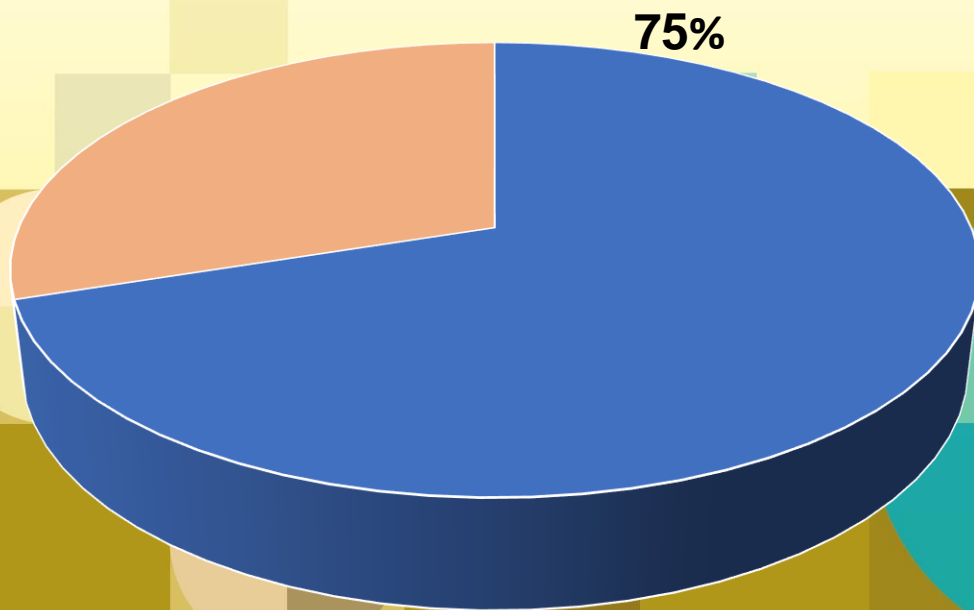
Nearly all parents and teaching staff interviewed considered the oceans and corals are important to humanity

Reflecting widespread agreement among respondents on the importance of oceans and corals to humanity



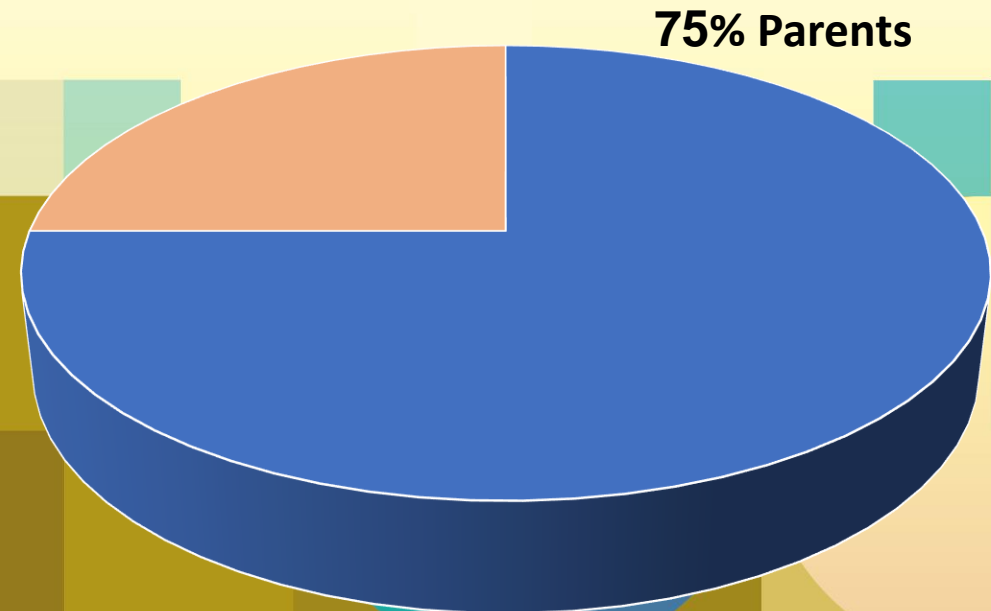
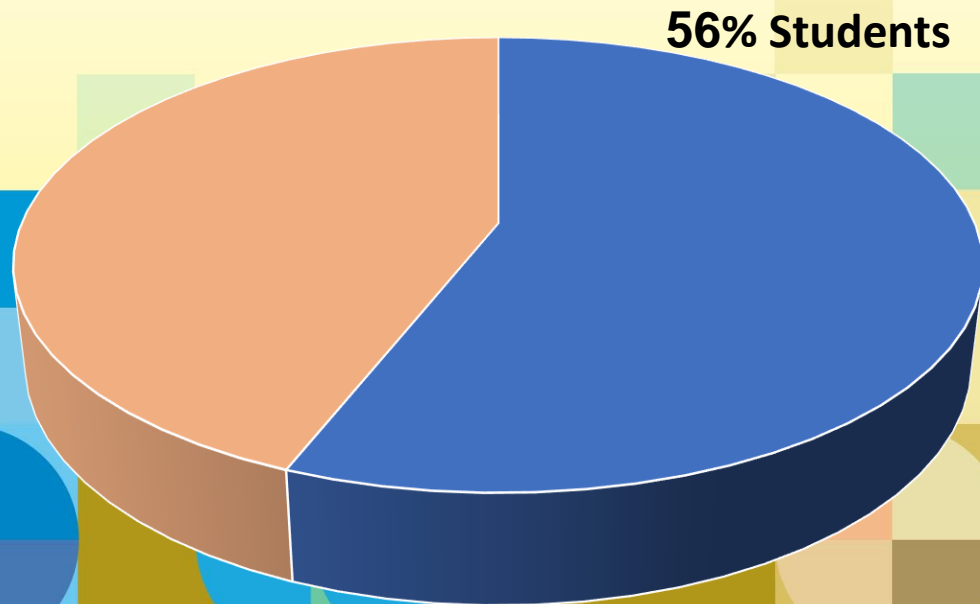
More than 70% of parents and teaching staff believe that marine conservation has an impact on their daily lives

Twenty-five percent of respondents believe it has no impact on their daily lives or are unclear of the impact



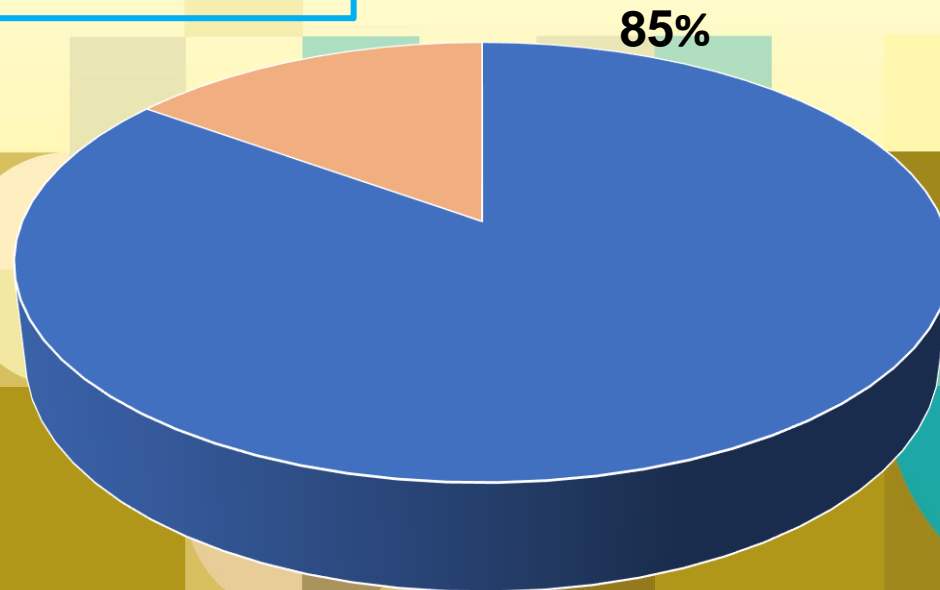
More than half of the students surveyed have not participated in ocean conservation-related activities

More than 70% of parents are willing to involve their children in related activities



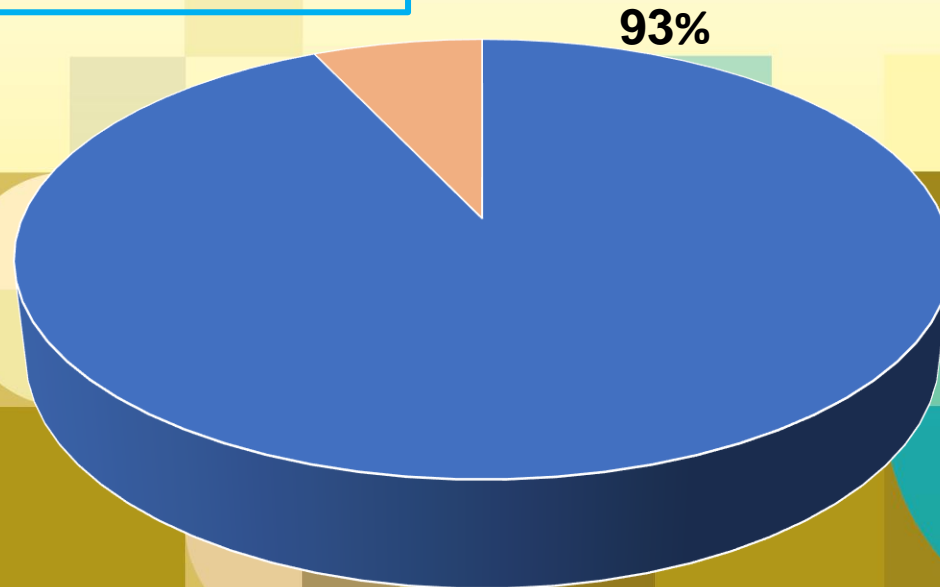
85% of parents and staffs surveyed felt that activities or courses on marine conservation issues were insufficient

Reflecting the serious inadequacy of marine conservation-related activities for the academic community



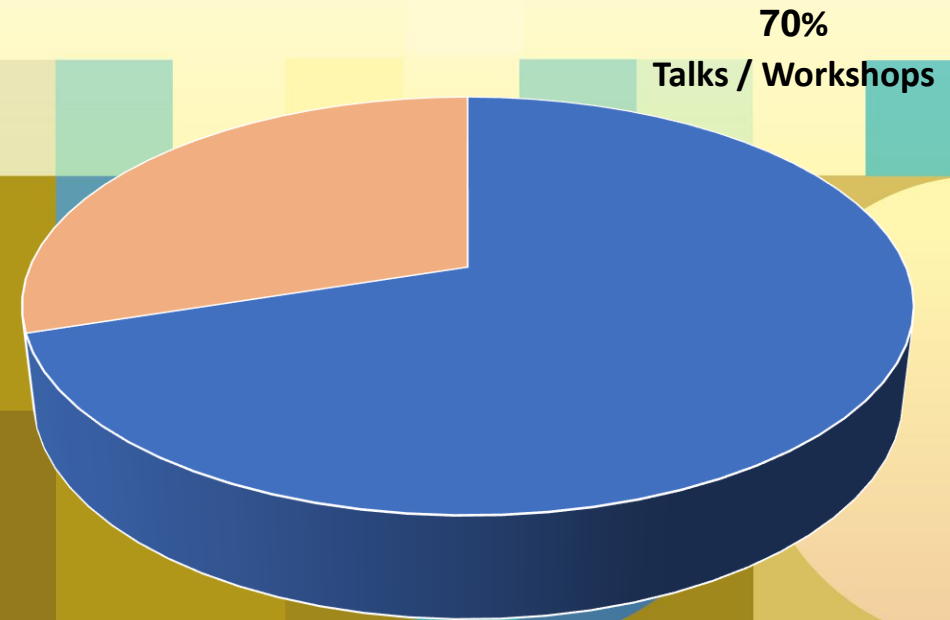
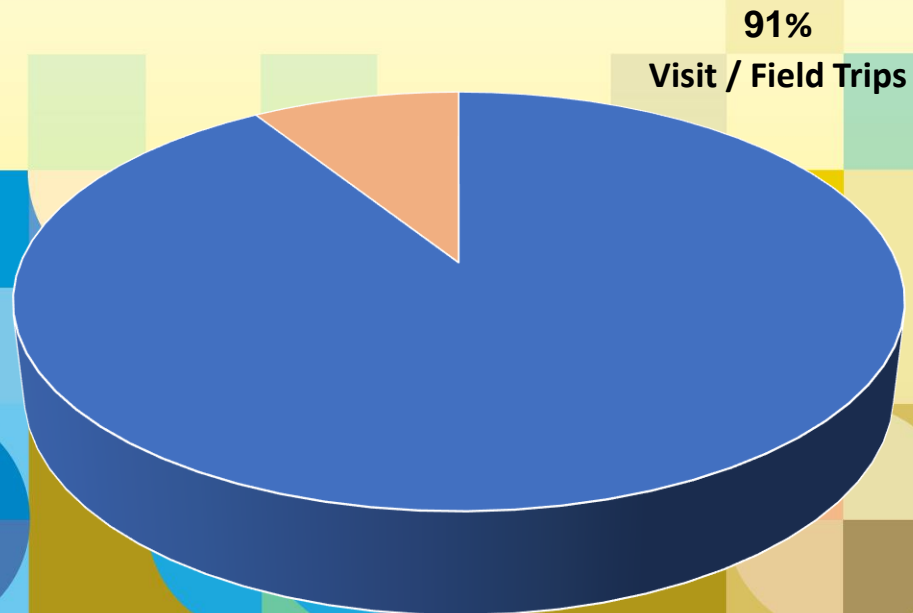
More than 90% of parents and teaching staff support and will participate in future marine conservation-related educational activities

Again, there is a need for more varieties of conservation-related activities



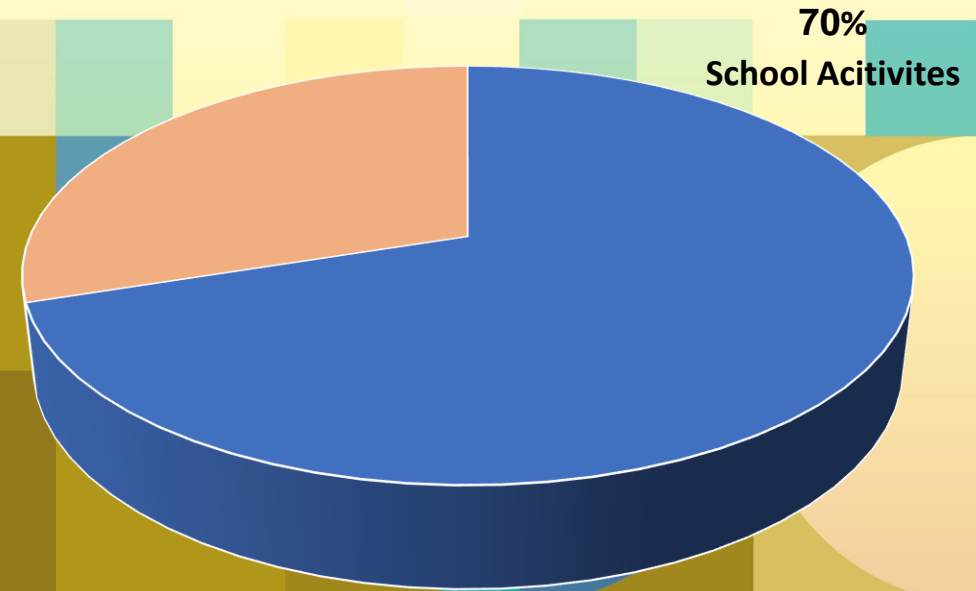
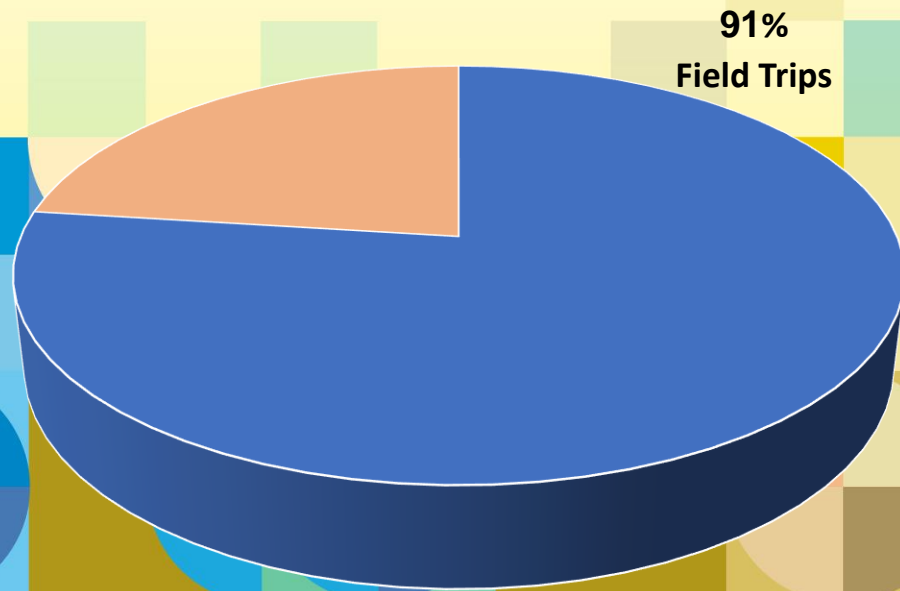
Most teachers and staff would like students to participate in educational activities related to marine conservation and coral conservation through visits, field trips and talks

Other types of activities include: exhibitions, workshops, competitions, etc.



Most of the staff surveyed felt that participation in field trips and school activities would encourage students to participate in educational activities related to marine conservation and coral conservation

Other influential factors include: extracurricular activities, parental support, services by reputable institutions and unique features in the programmes





## Summary

- The importance of oceans and corals to humans is widely recognized
- There is a need for more varieties of marine conservation activities

- Field trips can encourage more participation by schoolchildren
- Most parents and staff support, and are willing to participate in related ocean conservation activities
